We will have a visit on Wednesday 7th, 14th, 21st and 28th November. Plus we will have a further two visits in December!



We will have a fun filled adventure that will have us singing, dancing and clapping along! Featuring outstanding puppetry, dazzling sets and lavish costumes.





<u>Maths for the Month</u>

This month's colour is <u>yellow</u> – and this month's shape is the <u>triangle</u> – both these topics are important for pre mathematical development. Please encourage your child to look out for this colour and shape in their environment, at home and outside.

<u>Topics for the Month</u>

This month's topic is Me & My Family (grammatically correct "My Family and I"). Could you please provide your child with three family photographs stuck on the sheet provided with the family members' names underneath? Pictures of: 1) your child as a baby, 2) your child and their family, 3) your child's grandparents. This page with the photographs will be returned at the end of the month. If possible, could we have these photographs by <u>Wednesday 14th November</u>. Thank you.

We will use these stimuli to develop the theme of family, reassuring your child by acknowledging and naming their family. We will also touch on the idea of the passing of time and their personal history. We will discuss their homes and our school to develop an appreciation of their immediate environment.

We are looking for a volunteer / parent to bath their baby for us all to witness and enjoy! This would give us opportunities to develop the children's language and the idea of life cycles – baby, child, adult – in **The World** Around Us. Throughout this theme we will be reassuring them and so heightening their Personal, Social & Emotional Development. Through The Arts they will be encouraged to observe the similarities and differences in people and attempt to recreate a representational drawing/painting of a member of their family. Outside physical **development** will be concentrating on climbing and balancing safely.

<u>Morning Supervision 8.15am</u>

If you wish to avail of this service a member of staff will supervise the children. Please leave your child to the Quiet Room in Room One.

9.00 am the children will then go to their Quiet Rooms for a short greeting time to check who is present, say our prayers and discuss the activities on offer for the day. This is a lovely start to the day for the children!
