Come Outside - Pencils

General Questions:

- 1. What do you use pencils for?
- 2. Are pencils long and thin or short and wide?
- 3. Name 5 different colours of pencils you have.
- 4. What is your favourite thing to draw with pencils?
- 5. If you didn't have a pencil, what else could you use for writing?
- 6. What are pencils made of?

Questions about this episode:

- 1. What sort of pencil did Auntie Mabel need to draw? A light, thin pencil or a dark, thick pencil?
- 2. What did the shepherds discover graphite or coal?
- 3. How many hours do the strips stay in the oven to dry?
- 4. What colour did the pencils get painted in the factory?
- 5. What were the boys and girls in the classroom using the pencils for?

Extended Learning Ideas:

Chat to your child about:

- Starting big school and using pencils for writing everyday.
- What school they are going to.
- How to hold their pencil with a comfortable grip.
- Choosing a schoolbag and pencil case to put their pencils in.
- All the different types of work they will do in Primary School-
 - activities with pencils and without pencils.

Related Activities:

- Show your child their new schools' badge and help them draw it using pencils.
- Find pencils of different lengths in your house order them from smallest to largest
- When out a walk find a rock to paint at home.
- Scribble on a page this will improve pencil grip.
- Copy pictures or shapes mammy/daddy has drawn.
- Ask your child to draw a picture of them playing with new friends at their new school.
