Talking Tip

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Encourage your child to listen to different sounds, such as Cars and animals. This will help your child's listening skills.

You can help your child at home by ...

- Teach your child to blow their nose, pinch their nose to catch the germs and bin their hankie, ie "catch it, bin it, kill it".
- Cover your mouth whilst coughing.

of fun Autumn songs are being taught and Autumn stories being enjoyed, as well as lots of lovely art activities based on Autumn colours and Autumn leaves, Outdoors we will explore crisp Autumn leaves, our soil <mark>area will be p</mark>acked with real harvest fruits and vegetables including <mark>munc</mark>hkin pumpkins, carrots, potatoes and <mark>onions</mark> which we are counting and sorting! These varied and many activities not only build the children's awareness of Autumn but develops their <mark>voc</mark>abulary and mathematical sk<mark>ills as well</mark> touching on the Language Development and Early Mathematical Experiences areas of the curriculum.
