🕸 Dinners

Dinners started on Monday 1st October. The same system for collection of money will operate. It is imperative that you pay us on Tuesdays, as all money must be banked on Tuesday afternoons. School meals are £2.50 per day. Snack/Educational Outings/Resources Fund is £5.00 per week. Therefore, dinner and fund money will be £17.50 per week (exact money please and no cheques). If your child is entitled to free school meals and you have not completed a form see Mrs Hoy immediately.

🕸 Settling In Documents

Settling in documents will go out Thursday 18th October and you will be given the opportunity to discuss these with your child's teacher the following week. (An appointment date will be sent out shortly).

☆ School Records

Do you want to add any new names or telephone numbers to our school records? Have you changed address or telephone number? Is someone else collecting your child from school? If you want us to make any changes please speak to Mrs Gault on Tuesdays or Wednesdays.

☆ Parental Consent for Educational Outings

Parents, we require your consent to bring your child on educational outings. The third column of the consent form is where you indicate if you are free to join us. You are always welcome! Thank you.

☆ Outdoor Play

We have school coats which the children will wear for outdoor play but we would ask that you provide a hat and mittens (no gloves please), clearly marked with your child's name to remain in school. Please put them in the pouches inside your child's classroom. These will be sent home periodically for washing.

☆ Rosary

October is the month of the rosary. Our church encourages us to promote the saying of the rosary or a decade of the rosary as a family. We will have a rosary table to nurture the children's awareness of this powerful prayer!



☆ Jewellery

Due to the physical play we provide it is necessary for the children to wear only stud earrings and no other form of jewellery.

☆ Children's Work

☆ Curriculum Matters

Our special themes for the month are 'Myself' and 'Hallowe'en'.

We will be reading stories about babies, toddlers and big children starting school and making new friends! We will be learning how to share the space and equipment with these new friends. We will also be listening to stories and learning rhymes associated with Hallowe'en and reassuring the children by discussing the Hallowe'en traditions and learning some traditional rhymes. This gives us the opportunity to discuss **changes** occurring in Science whilst cooking stewed apples, making dough and orange soup. The children shall also be given the opportunity to learn **printing** techniques and attempt **collages** to enhance their creative skills. During our outside physical play we shall be concentrating on the skill of **pedalling**. Any donations of unwanted Little Tykes cars, dolls prams, wheelbarrows, bikes etc would be greatly appreciated.

If you are using this service, you MUST hand your child to a member of staff in Quiet Room One.

Again if you feel your child is ready, from Monday 1st October there will be a supervised waiting room from 1.30 pm to 2.00 pm each day.

These are non-teaching periods where your child can watch the television, will be read to or can enjoy browsing through books. Unfortunately this year, due to funding cuts, we are unable to provide a drop-off time any earlier than 8.15 am.


Dear Parents
